ELLEN O'CONNELL

Ellen O'Connell was the eldest daughter of the Liberator, *b.* in
 1805, she *d.* at Blackheath on 27 Jan. 1883. She *m.* in 1825,
 Christopher Fitzsimon, of Glancullen and Ordinary, J.P., D.L.,
 M.P. for Dublin co. 1832-37, and Clerk of the Hanaper Office of
 Ireland, a director of the National Bank, *b.* 1793; *d.* at Maserata
 in the Roman States, on St. Christopher's Day, 25 July, 1856.
 The Glancullen estate was purchased, 1676, by Thomas, of Ordinary,
 great, great, great grandfather of this Christopher.

They had thirteen children, and the number of their descendants
 is so great that it is proposed to deal first with the children of the
 marriage and then, separately, to deal *per stirpes* with the five
