- FH2 Eily O'Connell Fitzsimon Mrs. Bianconi. was the 9th child of Ellen O'Connell and Christopher Fitzsimon, M.P., and, therefore, one of the forty-seven grandchildren of the Liberator. She *m.* twice, and here we find her descendants by her 1st marriage with Charles Bianconi, junior, only son of Charles Bianconi, D.L., co. Tipperary, of Longfield House, Cashel, by Elizabeth Hayes, his wife. Charles Bianconi, senior, was *b.* 24 Aug. 1786, and *d.* 26 Sept. 1896, having amassed a large fortune, and at various times having bought a total of 4,954 Irish acres in co. Tipperary, at a cost of £70,315. He was the son of Pietro Bianconi, of Tregolo, Brienza, near Como, *d.* 1833, by Marie Catarina Mazza, his wife. Mrs. Bianconi, senior, who was *b.* about 1806, and *m.* 14 Feb. 1827, was the daughter of Patrick Hayes, stockbroker and notary public, who *m.* in about 1798, Henrietta Burton aged 16 the daughter of Capt. John Burton and Mary Anne de Burgh. Charles Bianconi, junior, *b.* 14 Oct. 1831; *m.* 26 April, 1859; *d.* 2 March, 1864, at Holyhead. Eily O'C. Fitzsimon, *b.* 25 Jan. 1838; *d.* 15 March, 1919.
