D1 DANIEL O'CONNELL

Daniel O'Connell was the 4th and youngest son of the Liberator, was *b.* 22 Aug. 1816, and *d.* at 46 Chapham Road, Bedford. Letters of Administration, at Somerset House, to Ellen, his widow. Was M.P. for Dundalk and Tralee, and Commissioner for Income Tax. Known in the family as "Dan the Commissioner" and "Little Red Dan"; *m.* 24 Oct. 1866, Ellen, only daughter of Ebenezer Foster, of the Elms, Cambridge, and grand-daughter of George Ebenezer Foster, of Anstey Hall, Cambridge, founder of the Bank of Foster and Foster, Cambridge. She was *b.* 19 Aug. 1847, and *d.* 3 March, 1913, at Overshand Mansions, Battersea Park. They had ten children, who were of the forty-seven grandchildren of the Liberator, they were,
