

- P3A1 Lucily Mary Emily O'Connell, *b.* at Grenagh, 19 Aug., 1885; a nun of the Sacred Heart Convent, Craiglockhart, Edinburgh; a specialist in Teaching and Educational Training.
- P3A2 Calista Mary Eileen O'Connell, *b.* at Aghadoe, Killarney 8 Aug., 1887; *d.* 15 May, 1895, and buried at Glasnevin.
- P3A3 Maurice James Arthur O'Connell, 5th Bart., *b.* 24 Dec., 1889; educated at St. Augustine's, Ramsgate, and Trinity College, Dublin; Captain, Royal Fusiliers (7th Regt.), seriously wounded at Gallipoli; Military Cross and mentioned in despatches; A.D.C. to his uncle, Major Sir William Hickie, K.C.B., commanding 16 (Irish) Division; a further mention in despatches. Succeeded his father as 5th Bart. in 1919; *m.* 1 June, 1920, Margaret Mary "Maisie" Purcell, dau. and co-heir of Matthew J. Purcell, of Burton Park, J.P., co. Cork and Dublin (*b.* 30 Nov., 1852), by Anne Maria Daly (*d.* 27 Mar., 1946), dau. of Peter Paul Daly, of Daly's Grove, by Anne, dau. of Hubert Thomas Dolphin, of Turao, co. Galway. Matthew J. Purcell was the only surviving child of John Purcell, of Burton Park, D.L. (*b.* 1801, *m.* 14 May, 1850, *d.* 5 Jan., 1853), by Anne Moore Dempsey, of Kildare (*d.* 1872). Mr. Purcell claimed to be the heir male to the Palatine Barony of Loughmoe. An account of Purcell, Daly, Dolphin and Dempsey descents will be given in a subsequent pamphlet. Sir Maurice is a Knight of Honour and Devotion of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta. They have
- P4A1 Morgan Donal Conail O'Connell, *b.* 29 Jan., 1923; served in Royal Corps of Signals in World War 2 in France and Germany.
- P4A2 Joan Mary Lucila O'Connell, *b.* 16 June, 1923; serving in W.R.N.S., 1947-8.
- P3A4 Donal Bernard O'Connell, *b.* 3 June, 1893; educated St. Anthony's School, Eastbourne, and Royal Naval Colleges, Osborne and Dartmouth; served in Royal Navy, 1906-46; Captain R.N., retired; served in both World Wars (War Medals), and from 1940-6 commanded H.M.S. *Resource* (C.B.E.); Jubilee Medal, 1935; Member Royal Irish Academy and an expert on pre-History; Knight of Honour and Devotion of the Sovereign Military Order of Malta; living at Maulagh, Lakeview, Fossa, Killarney; *unm.*
- P3A5 Basil Morgan O'Connell, *b.* 15 June, 1900; the compiler of these tracts; *m.* 29 Apr., 1935, Lucila Concha Deasy, his first cousin, younger and only surviving daughter of Major H. H. P. Deasy, by Dolores Mercedes, dau. of Lt.-Col. J. F. Hickie, of Slevoyre, J.P., above-mentioned. Major Deasy was *b.* 29 June, 1866; *d.* 26 Jan., 1947; served in the Kerry Militia, 15 Apr., 1886, and in 16th Lancers from 9 Nov., 1888, and won the Royal Geographical Society Founders' Gold Medal, 10 May, 1900, "for the exploration and surveying work he accomplished in Central Asia, during two expeditions lasting 3 years altogether. He was incessantly engaged in surveying districts where an experienced professional surveyor would find exceptional difficulties." He was the patenter of the Deasy motor car—afterwards Siddley-Deasy, and published, in May, 1914, one of the first attempts to view realistically the rising danger of traffic problems, a pamphlet "The Problem of Road Traffic and its Solution." Much that he advocated has since—slowly and tardily—become a commonplace. Major Deasy settled at Cnoc na Faire, Carrigahorig. He was the only surviving child of the Rt. Hon. Rickard Morgan Lord Justice Deasy, Q.C., LL.D., M.P. (*b.* 27 Dec., 1812, *d.* 6 Máý, 1883), by Monica O'Connor (*b.* 18 May, 1833, *m.* 20 April, 1863), *d.* 24 March, 1883. Monica O'Connor was 22nd in proven descent from Roderick O'Connor, last monarch of Ireland of the Milesian line. This descent is registered at the College of Arms, Queen Victoria Street, London. A subsequent Tract will deal with the pedigrees of Deasy, Cotter, O'Donovan, Cashin, O'Connor and Henchy. The latter two families have already appeared in the form of a Tract published in about 1907 by Valentine Hussey Walshe. Basil and Lucila have had the following children,

- P2A6 James Ross O'Connell ("Shamus"), *b.* 28 Aug., 1863; educated at the Oratory; joined Kerry Militia, 1881, and thence King's Own Shropshire Light Infantry (85th Regt.); served with the Egyptian Army from 1 Apr., 1891, and in the Egyptian Army 28 June, 1898; he became Civil and Military Governor of the Province of Kordofan, 1903; Sudan Medal, 1896; Osmanich, 3rd Class, and Medjidich, 3rd Class, and Khedive's Medal with 6 clasps (Firket, Hafir, Sudan, 1899, Khartoum, Gedaref and Talodi); mentioned in despatches, G.N., 30 Sept., 1898; retired, due to ill-health, with rank of Major, 8 Mar., 1907, but returned to duty in 1914 to recruit and raise the 13th Durham Light Infantry, with rank of Lt.-Col., but was again invalided; *d.* *unm.* 25 Sept., 1925, at Dublin; buried Glasnevin.
- P1B Daniel James O'Connell, *b.* 5 Oct., 1823; educated Downside and University College, London; B.L. (Middle Temple); J.P., co. Cork and Kerry; High Sheriff, Kerry, 1868; *m.* 25 June, 1863, Frances Mary, youngest dau. and co-heir of Denis Shyne Lawlor, J.P., of Castlelough and Grenagh. Dan James *d.* 26 Feb., 1888, and she *d.* 16 June, 1894. They had,
