

- P2B1 James Donal O'Connell, *b.* 6 Aug., 1864; *Lt.* Royal Irish Rifles, 10 Nov., 1886; he retired and settled in California, where he married, but the surname of his wife is not known to the writer (Miss Seraph —); he *d.* childless, on 21 Dec., 1909. She re-married and was subsequently killed in a motor-car accident. He is buried at Calvary Cemetery, Los Angeles.
- P2B2 Donal O'Connell, of Grenagh, *b.* 11 Apr., 1867, and in 1948 "the doyen of the Sept"; lived in Canada for some years; was at one time a very determined committee member of the Garrick Club, and did much to regenerate it; *m.* Nov., 1902, Frances Beatrice, who *d.* at Haywards Heath, *s.p.*, on June, 1934; he is living at 33 Upper Rock Gardens, Brighton, *s.p.*
- P2B3 Maurice O'Connell, *b.* 1 Sept., 1875; intended for a career in diplomacy, but entered the Order of Trappist Monks at the Grande Chartreuse, in Savoy; he was, subsequently at Chartreuse in Tarrogon, Spain (1926), and Lucca (Italy); in 1947 he was at Chartreuse at Voisin Isere, France.
- P2B4 Morgan Henry O'Connell, *b.* 28 Jan., 1880, and *d.* on 3 Feb. 1902, from wounds received at Elandsfontein, on 1 Feb., 1902; he was Trooper C804 of the South African Constabulary, and is mentioned as serving in the Kafferistan Rifles and the Governor's Bodyguard; *unm.*
- P2B5 (Conall) Geoffrey O'Connell, *b.* 31 Jan., 1882; settled in Minnesota and subsequently in California; visited Ireland in 1948; Barrister-at-Law; living 2284 Bronson Hill Drive, Hollywood, 28, Los Angeles, California; *m.* 1stly, 4 Sept., 1913, Eleanor Valleley, *d.s.p.* 8 Jan., 1919, and *m.* 2ndly, 14 Sept., 1922, Mary Dean Crowell, *s.p.*
- P2B6 Edward O'Connell, *b.* 11 Feb., 1884; *d.* at Ryde 13 Feb., 1887.
- P2B7 Isobel Maude O'Connell, *b.* 11 Apr. 1866; *m.*, at Fossa Church, Lakeview, 23 Apr., 1891, Capt. Edmond O'Connor, of Charleville, Dunleer, Co. Louth, Royal Irish Rifles (6th Batt.); J.P., D.L., High Sheriff, co. Louth, 1894. He was born 11 Apr., 1868, and *d.* 31 Aug., 1932; he was the only child of Major Richard Ross O'Connor, 17th (Leinster) Regt. (*b.* 23 Jan., 1820, *d.* at Thonon, 23 Aug., 1877), by Angel, dau. of Chevalier Jean Beaurain de Seyessel of Thonon. She afterwards *m.* the Comte de Noue. Major Richard Ross O'Connor was the son of Patrick O'Connor (*b.* 21 Apr., 1794, *m.* 2 Feb., 1819, *d.*, at Venice, 31 Mar., 1865) and Margaret Ross, *b.* 16 Apr., 1794, *d.* 18 Apr., 1879, at Montreux), whose twin sister *m.* Patrick's 2nd brother, Sir Richard O'Connor, K.C.H. A further account of the Ross and O'Connor pedigree will be published in a subsequent tract. Mrs. Maude O'Connor was awarded the O.B.E. for services during World War I, and *d.* 13 June, 1926; she is buried in Termonfeckin, co. Louth. They had
- P3C1 Richard Daniel O'Connor, "Dick," *b.* 6 Mar., 1892; Capt. Royal Leinster Regt.; served in World War I, and was a prisoner of war in Germany; *m.* 11 June, 1924, Iris St. Claire, dau. of R. T. Daniel. Capt. O'Connor lives at Gresford Formby, Lincs. They have an only child,
- P4C1 Margaret O'Connor, "Peggy," *b.* 2 Apr., 1925; serving in the W.R.N.S.
- P3C2 Edmond O'Connor, "Joe," *b.* 12 July, 1893; educated R.N.C. Osborne and Dartmouth; served in World War I; retired Lt.-Comdr., R.N.; *m.* Violet, dau. of Sir Francis Elliot, G.C.M.G., G.C.V.O., only son of the Rt. Hon. Sir Henry Elliot, P.C., G.C.B., a son of Lord Minto. Edmond *d.s.p.* at Nice, 20 Jan., 1924.
- P3C3 Evelyn John O'Connor, "Barney," *b.* 25 June, 1896; Lt.-Col. in Royal Tank Corps; served in 1st and 2nd World War and in operations on the Indian Frontier; O.B.E., M.C. and War Medals; he *m.* Mollie, dau. of Col. Chitty, and they have
- P4D1 Valdis O'Connor, *b.* 26 Jan., 1931.
- P4D2 Iris O'Connor, *b.* 22 Dec., 1934.
- P2B8 Eva O'Connell, *b.* 17 Oct., 1871; a minaturist; living, in 1948, at Cheriton House, Templecombe, Somerset; *unm.*
- P2B9 Claire O'Connell, *b.* 16 Oct., 1873; *d.* at St. Mary's House, Priorswick, Glos., 3 Aug., 1918, *unm.*
- P2B10 Mary Bernadette "Maisy" O'Connell, *b.* 21 Nov., 1876; a nun of the Sacred Heart Order and Reverend Mother of their Convents at Brighton, Rugby and, in 1947, in Isle of Wight.
- P2B11 Dorothy O'Connell, *b.* 8 Mar., 1888, a nun of the Sacred Heart Order; *d.* at their convent at Farnham Hall, Newcastle-on-Tyne, 3 Dec., 1931.
- P1C Charles James, "Mr. Charles," *b.* 15 July, 1828; lived at Lakeview with his brother, and *d.* there 27 Oct., 1893.
- P1D James O'Connell, *b.* 18 July, 1832; *d.* 1 Oct., 1855.
- P1E Morgan James O'Connell, *b.* 1 Nov., 1833, at Lakeview; joined The Royal (1st Regt.); Ensign 27 May, 1853, Lt. 8 Dec., 1854, Capt. 6 Sept., 1855, Major 8 Sept., 1870; served in Crimea War (British Medal and clasp for Sebastapol, Turkish Medal and Order of Medjedech, 5th Class); in China War, 1860 (medal and 2 clasps, Taku Forts and Peking); A.D.C. to H.E. The Lord Lieutenant of Ireland, 1865-66. This officer, who was expected to reach high rank, died of an epidemic in Jhansi, India, *unm.*, 2 Oct., 1870
