

CONCLUSION

We have now surveyed in

- Tract No. 1. The descendants of the Liberator, 1775-1847.
- Tract No. 2. The descendants of his father, 1739-1808.
- Tract No. 3. (1) The descendants of Charles Connell Fitz Philip, being O'Connells of the Glen and their descendants.
(2) The descendants of the O'Connells of Spa from about 1730.

We still have plenty to do.

- A. The Ballinablown main stem, the recording of which is practically complete.
- B. The descendants of the aunts and uncle of the Liberator, being descendants of Donal Mor O'Connell.
- C. The O'Connells of Tarmons, being the descendants of Donal Mor's younger brother, Maurice.
- D. The descendants of Maurice (Dan, Jeffry) O'Connell, of Dunman-
heen, d. 1718, the uncle of Donal Mor and Maurice of Tarmons.
- E. The very confused information covering the XVII century which connects the O'Connells of Breantre, Co. Clare (Brigadier Maurice, killed at Aughrim), John Connell, of Ashtown (will of 1680), the O'Connells of Darrinane and those of Ballinablown, and possibly the extinct O'Connells of Kilfinny.

Jeffry Mac Morice O'Connell, of Ballycarbery,
Murrogh Mac Morrice O'Connell, of same,
Shane Mac Morrice, of Ballycarbery
Jeffry and Morrice Mac Murragh O'Connell of same,
Richard Grownige McDonnell Grownne O'Connell, of Ballycarbie,
Shane and Rickard McDonnell oge O'Connell.

These Fiants have not yet been checked but are quoted from the *Kerry Archeological Magazine* of April, 1916.
