### JANE FRANCES O'CONNELL OF GRENA

L1C

For the sake of clearness the descendants of her two marriages are shown under separate headings:

#### 1st Marriage:

The exact date of Jane's birth is as yet unascertained, but it seems probable that it was in 1812. She *m.*, first, Charles (James) The O'Donoghue of the Glens. He was *b.* in 1807, and was the son of Charles The O'Donoghue, *b.* 1777; *d.* 1808; who *m.* Mary, dau. of James Morrogh, of Cork. Charles (James) was the brother of Jane O'Donoghue who, on 31 March, 1818, *m.* James O'Connell, afterwards Sir James, 1st Baronet of Lakeview and uncle to Jane Frances. The descent of The O'Donoghues of the Glens will be dealt with in a subsequent tract, but suffice it to say that Geoffrey, The O'Donoghue, great grandfather of Charles (James) *m.* Elizabeth, heir-general of the House of McCarthy Mor, and aunt of the last McCarthy Mor (*d.* 13 July, 1770). The O'Donoghue, therefore, is the representative of two of the oldest and most distinguished Celtic families. Charles (James) *d.* on 1 May, 1833, at Florence, Tuscany; and she gave birth to a posthumous and only child,

Daniel The O'Donoghue of the Glens, *b.* 1833; *d.* 7 Oct., 1889. M.P. for co. Tipperary, 1857-1865, M.P. for Tralee, 1865-85. He married Mary Sophia, dau. and heir of Sir John Ennis, Bt., of Ballinahown Court, Athlone. She *d.* 1891. He is buried in Muckcross Abbey, and she at Kilomeenahan Athlone. They had,

Jeffrey Charles Patrick The O'Donoghue of the Glens, *b.* 18 Jan., 1859; *d.*, at Dunlaoghaire, 13 June, 1935, and buried at Clonmacnoise, King's Co. He *m.*, in 1895, Anna Mathilda, youngest dau. of William Charlton, of Clonmacnoise House. She *d.* 23 July, 1921, and is buried at Clonmacnoise. They had,

Geoffrey The O'Donoghue of the Glens, *b.* 8 Oct., 1896; living at Raheendan, Rathvilly, Co. Carlow, in 1947. He *m.*, in 1935, Kathleen Finnegan, and has,

Geoffrey Vincent Paul O'Donoghue, *b.* 19 July, 1937

L5C2

Francis Aiden O'Donoghue, *b.* 13 Aug., 1939.

L5C3

Angela Mary O'Donoghue, *b.* 17 Dec., 1943; *d.* 10 Jan., 1944.

L5C4

Catherine Mary O'Donoghue, *b.* 1 Jan., 1945.

L4C2

Maud Mary O'Donoghue, *b.* 1894; alive 1947.

L4C3

Nora Kathleen O'Donoghue, *b.* 1895; alive 1947.

L3C2

Charles John Joseph O'Donoghue, *b.* 1860, on whom Ballinahown Court was settled by entail. He *m.*, 20 July, 1892, Miss Rose Dalton and *d.s.p.* 1903. Buried at Ballinahown. Daniel O'Donoghue, *d.* 1888, *unm.* Buried at Kilmeenahan, Athlone.

L3C3

John O'Donoghue, *b.* 1872; called to the Irish Bar; *unm.*

L3C4

Alive at Wave Crest Hotel, Dun Laoghaire, 1947.

L3C5

Angus O'Donoghue, *b.* 14 Oct., 1875; *d.* 28 Oct., 1908; buried Glasnevin; *unm.*

L3C6

Florence O'Donoghue succeeded to Ballinahown in 1908; *m.* Miss Ellen Dalton, sister of Rose Dalton above-mentioned. He *d.* 7 July, 1919, and is buried in Muckcross Abbey. They had,

L4D1

Francis O'Donoghue, *b.* 1893; *d.* *unm.* 8 Feb., 1920. and buried at Kilomeenahan.

This ends the list of the 15 descendants of Jane Frances O'Connell by her marriage with Charles (James) The O'Donoghue as they were recorded on 10 Aug., 1947.

#### 2nd Marriage:

L1C

Jane Frances *m.* 2ndly, on 29 Oct., 1839, John MacCarthy O'Leary, of Coomlagane, near Millstreet, co. Cork. He was a J.P. for cos. Kerry and Cork; D.L. for co. Cork; High Sheriff for 1854. He was *b.* 19 Sept., 1814, and was the eldest son of Denis McCarthy O'Leary, of Coomlagane, *b.* 1774, and of Leonra, dau. of John Howley, of Richell, co. Limerick (Leonora *d.* 1832). Denis was the eldest son of Denis McCarthy, of Glynn, *b.* 1731, and *m.* 1st, in 1770, Anne dau. of Felix McCarthy, of Spring House, co. Tipperary (she *d.* 1780). Denis *m.* 2ndly, Helen, only dau. and heir of The O'Leary (of Millstreet). The O'Leary estates and name devised upon Helen's stepson, Denis McCarthy O'Leary above-named. Denis McCarthy, of Glynn, was the only son of Justin McCarthy (*m.* 1730) and Anne, dau. of Charles McCarthy, of Lyradane, co. Cork. Justin was the eldest son of another Denis McCarthy, of Dooneen, *b.* 1677; *d.* 24 June, 1761; *m.* Jane, dau. of T. Barrett, of Barretts' Country. Denis, of Dooneen, was the son of Donogh MacDermot McCarthy, of Dooneen and Carhue, who *m.*, prior to 1635 Eleanor, dau. of Darby O'Callaghan, of Kilpeadur, co. Cork, and sister of Cahir O'Callaghan (will dated 1679). It is claimed that Dermot was a son of Donogh MacCarthy, of Drishane, of the noble House of Muskerry.
