THE ANCESTRY OF DANIEL O'CONNELL AND MARY O'CONNELL

At the time of the rise to fame of the Liberator, it was the fashion to ascribe to the illustrious lengthy pedigrees connecting the hero to the "chiefs of yore." Such pedigrees sometimes turn

out to be strictly accurate, sometimes the light of modern scientific investigation shows them to be mythical.

Later, especially in the period between the world wars, the fashion changed, and for the hero to be a great proletarian of uncertain origin and earthy antecedents was considered romantic.

The latter picture is one quite out of perspective in the case of Paniel O'Connell.

Whatever may be the truth of the long pedigrees which have appeared in books and those which are stored at Darrynane, Killeena, Maulagh, Lakeview, etc., the facts subsequent to 1650 are very nearly those which can be found in

It is dated 17 Jan., 1683: he d. s.p. In his will is mentioned the lands of Canburren, then "the ancient patrimony of his ancestors." This farm passed to his nephew, John, John's eldest son, Daniel, Daniel s son Morgan of Carhen, the father of the Liberator.
