### COLLATERALS

We have sketched out roughly, but accurately and fairly comprehensively, 860 of the descendants of the marriage of 1771. In pursuance of our plan to record all the descendants of Morgan of Carhens, grandfather John, the first of Darrynane, let us sketch out the immediate collaterals of Morgan. The writer has not the time now to set them out in full nor is our knowledge sufficiently full to justify the expense of printing until more work has been done upon them. but let us see what the problem is which confronts us, in taking the next step—the completion of a record of the descendants of Morgan's father, Donal Mor O'Connell or Connell, who died in 1770, and who is buried on Abbey Island, Darrynane. He it was who married Maire ni Dhuv O'Donoghue. We do not yet know the date of this marriage, but we do know that there were 22 children, of whom only 5 sons and 8 daughters reached maturity. Of these the eldest son was John, b. 1725, but two of his surviving sisters, Elizabeth and Alice were born before John. It is safe to say, therefore, that the marriage took place about 1720. We have Donal "Mor's" will of 19 Sept., 1770, to guide us.

Our task to complete the record consequent on the marriage of 1720 is, therefore, to record the descendants of the following:

1. John Connell, b. 1725; m. Jan., 1748, Mary dau. of John Falvey, of Faha, and d. at Darrynane, on 2 May, 1751, during the life of his father. They had issue only one dau., Abigail or Gobnett, b. 1750, who m., before 1770, James Gould, of Clonakilty. Both were of hasty tempers and they soon parted. We do not yet know whether there was issue of this marriage.
2. Maurice O'Connell (or Connell), called "Hunting Cap," b. 1726; he m., 5 Dec., 1758, Mary, dau. and co-heir of Robert Cantillon, of Ballyphilip, by Mary, the dau. and eventually, on the death of her brother Thady (30 July, 1784), co-heir of John O'Brien, of Clounties, Mullogh and Moyvanine, Co. Limerick. Hunting Cap improved his patrimony, and died a wealthy man, possessed of large landed interests in Kerry. When Catholics became eligible for the post he was appointed a Deputy Governor of Kerry (1793), d.s.p. 1825.
3. Morgan O'Connell, of Carhen (1739-1809), 860 of whose descendants are dealt with in Tracts 1 and 2.
4. Connell O'Connell, b. about 1740. He went to sea early and writes from San Sebastian, 19 July, 1757, and from Hamburg on 21 Mar., 1760. In the latter letter he describes adventures off the Bahama Islands and in "New Yorke." He was lost overboard, when his ship was wrecked off the west coast of Ireland in the spring of 1765. d.s.p.
5. Daniel Charles O'Connell, b. 21 May, 1745, Count of France, Peer of the Kingdom of the French and Knight Grand Cross of the Military Order of St. Louis. He is the subject of an article in the *Dictionary of National Biography*, and his life is set out in *The Last Colonel of the Irish Brigade*, by Mrs. M. J. O'Connell. He d. without issue surviving, at the Chateau de Madon on 9 July, 1833.

The daughters of the marriage who reached maturity were:

6. Elizabeth O'Connell (named for her grandmother, Elizabeth Conway) b. before 1725; m. Timothy McCarthy, of Ochtermoney and Liss, before 1744. The account of the descendants of this marriage (9 in all) is to be found in the *Kerry Archeological Magazine* of April, 1918, page 255. It is believed that the issue of this marriage became totally extinct on the death (11 July, 1902), at the age of 93, of Madame Evaline McCarthy.
7. Alice O'Connell, b. before 1725, and m., about 1750, John Seggerson, of the Manor of Ballinaskelligs. She was still alive in 1819. She had a dau., Mary, who m. Toby Spottswood, and another, Joanne, who m. Charles Geoffrey O'Connell, of
