Took part in the relief of Ladysmith, including operations of 17-20 June, 1900, and action at Spion Kop; operations of 5 and 7 Feb.; actions at Vaal Kravattz, Tugela Heights, Pieter's Hill. Laings Nek. Twice mentioned in despatches. Brevet of the ancient family of Lempriere, of Rosel Manor, Jersey. see Burke's Landed Gentry, 1925. They had Helen Margery Lempriere, b. Poona, India, 23 May, 1886, and living at Marchands, Farringdon, Alton, Hants, in 1950.
