He had inherited the sword presented to Sir Maurice Charles Philip O'Connell, his great grandfather, and took the part of that worthy in the pageant at the opening of the great Sydney Bridge, in which he appeared in his great grandfather's original sword and decorations. He m. Miss Anne Cropper, who lived (1945) in Derby Road, Vauclose, Sydney. They had one child Maurice O'Connell, b. 1929. Q4B2E2

This ends a very incomplete account of 24 of the descendants of Captain William Bligh J. O'Connell. The writer has failed to make contact with this Branch of the family, but it is hoped that this Tract may find its way into the hands of a descendant, and allow of a fuller recording to be made.

#### CARLO O'CONNELL

Here again details are lacking. It is known that he was the third son and m. Anne Hester Baldock, and it is thought the marriage was childless. He is shown in contempory records as C. P. O'Conneil, which is thought to be Charles Phillip. He was appointed an Ensign in the 51st Regiment (K.O.Y.L.I.) on 1 July, 1842, and was promoted (without purchase) to Lieutenant in 65th Regiment on 4 July, 1845. Served as Major of Brigade to the Forces in New Zealand from April, 1845—Jan., 1846. He was present at the attack on Haki's Pah at Mawie, and at that on the Waikaidi River and at the capture of Pomari's Pah at Ruapekapeka, 11 Jan., 1846. He was still in the 1850 Army List, but not in the 1855 List, and is thought to have retired. Nothing further of him is known to the writer. 02B3

### . RICHARD O'CONNELL

The youngest son of the Lt.-General. The dates of his birth and death are not known. He m. Mary Rose Bligh. A note has been found that they had one son, James Laurence O'Connell, but the majority of records show them as childless. He joined the Royal Artillery as 2nd Lieutenant on 19 June, 1841, and rose to 1st Lieutenant, 13 April, 1842; Captain, 30 June, 1848; Brevet-Major, 11 April, 1860; Lt.-Colonel, 28 July, 1861; Brevet-Colonel, 25 July, 1866; Colonel, 15 Nov., 1869. He had retired before 1883. In 1864, at the time of his mother's death, he is shown as commanding 14th Brigade Royal Artillery at Secunderabad, India. Q2B5

Lord William Henry George Somerset (b. 2 Sept., 1748; d. 14 Jan., 1857) by Elizabeth (b. 26 April, 1790; d. 15 Aug., 1834), dau. Lt.-Gen. Sir Thomas Molyneaux, 5th Bart, and was a grandson of Henry, 5th Duke of Beaufort. Henry Charles became an Ensign in 51st Regiment, 4 Oct., 1833; Lieutenant, 14 July, 1837; Capitain, 23 June, 1843; Major, 20 June, 1854; Lt.-Colonda J June, 1860, and Colonel, 1 Oct., 1870.
